

Open calls for entry for visual artists

curatorial statement

When I was asked to write the introduction to this exhibition, I knew I wanted to discuss the issue of inclusion/exclusion and why I believe it's necessary to push back against cultural elitism. To be sure, we as

marginalized artists.

Canadians live within a veritable mosaic of cultures. There is no single identity or overarching narrative that defines every individual within this country. As such, I was excited to see what types of paintings our call for entry would attract.

We received over 200 submissions from across Canada. The works ranged in style from realism to impressionism; some capturing the Canadian landscape and others the isolation of quarantine. I was thoroughly impressed by the calibre of the paintings and I would like to thank everyone who took the time to submit work.

Painting 2020 opens with the theme "presence"—denoting the minute details that make up the everyday experience of living in the world.

Indeed, in the past eight months we

have all become increasingly aware of the movements of ourselves and others as we continue to maintain social distancing and prepare for the winter ahead. The first work in this section is Person to Person by Arnie Lipsey. Here, this piece considers the narrative of family dynamics and how we communicate with and understand our kin. Modelled after neoclassicism. Person to Person emulates the simplicity and symmetry of the movement while also borrowing the style of a mythological work. Indeed, Lipsey's use of bright acrylics works to accentuate the image of the burning train materializing from the kitchen cupboard. What secrets does this family hold?

The intent to communicate and understand one another is further explored in part II: thinking/feeling, a collection of abstract paintings.

I don't believe it's a coincidence that many of the submissions we received were in the abstract style. Abstract expressionism emerged in the United States in the 1940s and 50s as a response to the Great Depression and the crisis of the Second World War and its aftermath. It wouldn't be unfounded to compare the interconnected global crises of the pandemic, the rise of the far-right, increasing wealth disparity, mass unemployment, and the continued fight for civil rights with the instability of the mid-twentieth century. With an emphasis on form, colour, and line, pieces like Marianne Fowler's Dwelling 2 and Marie Lannoo's Pink Fire are non-representational and elusive, inviting the viewer to subjectively interpret what these paintings mean for them. To understand, we must first look inward and sit with our thoughts

and feelings. We must also ask, "what is the self-image of society? How does it reason with itself, describe itself, imagine itself"?

Abstract art is also present in part IV: landscape. Canadians have often turned to the land when searching for identity, whether national or individual. If there's one thing we have in abundance in Canada, it's the natural environment. Indeed, many of us have experienced the sublime in our own backyards, amidst the mountains and frozen deserts of the Canadian landscape. As such, I find it especially interesting that many of the landscape submissions we received chose to participate in the genre in an abstract way. The paintings by Patricia Morris, Passing Winter Birch and Rock Cut, Newfoundland, engage with the viewer as if they were a

passenger in a moving vehicle. How does our understanding of time shift when we're moving versus when we're still? How do notions of time impact our engagement with the self? How often do we experience true stillness? We began to ask ourselves these questions as we sat in lockdown last spring, prompting many of us to re-evaluate our priorities and interactions with the world around us. Indeed, we're beginning to ask ourselves these questions again. Together, the paintings in this year's exhibition ask critical questions about interaction, memory and time, prompting viewers to take a moment, sit still, and see. My hope is that this book will give people an opportunity to sit and engage with some truly beautiful paintings on their own time, without feeling rushed to see and understand all at once.




