

Rich in detail and texture, this Oshibana artwork is the result of layering thousands of pressed leaves, fern pieces and petals applied with archival glue.



I have used ningma, dusty miller, fall sumac, natural Japanese maple, high mountain silver stem, red Japanese maple, fall sugar maple, fall ornamental pear, nine bark leaves, green aspen, and fall ginkgo leaves. Also used were stem dyed hydrangea and white larkspur petals, as well as frosted fern or saginella, leather leaf, asparagus, and rhombus ferns.



"Entangled" is one of a series of works inspired by Toronto's Leslie Street Spit; a finger of land built with construction rubble, then reclaimed by nature. Presenting as a vibrant natural landscape, on second look, evidence of the Spit's creation (broken concrete, twisted rebar, shards of brick) pokes through and pierces the illusion. This visual intersection of built and organic forms is both jarring and joyous.

The essence of the Spit reflects the circular and impermanent nature of life: what was once in the earth (stone, metal, clay) became built structure, then became earth again.

Using materials found on the Spit, the cyanotype imagery incorporates light and shadow to explore the relationship between the underlying structure and the living surface of this unusual landscape. The hand stitching binds together these visual fragments while marking out the passage of time.



For me, this piece references a world where the local wildlife displays physical abnormalities and maladaptive behaviours. Alluding to images of the animal mutations that resulted from nuclear accidents — like Chernobyl (1986) and Fukushima (2011) — and other manmade catastrophes, this imagined creature functions as an ominous 'canary in the coal mine'; featuring traits that will inevitably hinder its survival.

This artwork purposefully exploits the Canada goose as a longstanding symbol of Canadian identity, especially as it speaks to our relationship with the land. Double Trouble complicates this identity by presenting the viewer with a fictional omen of Canada's ecological collapse.

Mark Gleberzon: There's an underlying balance of simplicity, humour and alarm in this work. It works as an effective statement on our current global-environment concerns. But it does so without being manipulative or preachy. "Double Trouble" is also really quirky which I also appreciated. The careful and precise rendering of the back and neck feathers and clean lines elevated this work even more.





Award Of Excellence: "Paloma" Artist: Melissa Rempel

JURORS' REMARKS:

Jodi Wheeler: I adore this piece. "Paloma" is so fun and has a wonderful use of colour. The balance and form in this photograph are outstanding. This piece is completely marketable from a comical design standpoint, but also would be so fun as a series of cocktail photos for a gallery collection. Very fresh fun and playful, really enjoyed this artwork.

Mark Gleberzon: This was a standout amongst the applications. And photography is often overlooked in these scenarios. The colours and composition immediately radiated out and I got the concept without having to read the artist's statement. It's also simply a lot of fun and very joyful. The strategic use of digital elements is subtle and sublime. It's an extremely contemporary composition and I either now want a drink or better yet, want to see more work from this series.
